



Explore the Redwoods

Get lost in time exploring the ancient redwood forest. Ranging from 500 to 3000 years old, these giant trees inspire awe and wonder as you meander through the road and trail systems. As one of the first protected ecosystems, the redwoods offer expansive old growth forests and pristine rivers.

Accessibility

Redwood is a diverse park with landscapes as varied as beaches, forests, hills, trails, open prairies and wild rivers. What you need to know

Dress Accordingly

The coast is often much cooler than the Rogue and Umpqua valleys. Be sure to check your favorite weather app and bring along a sweatshirt or jacket for walks on the beach.

Gas Up

Gas is far less expensive in the Rogue Valley than on the Oregon or California coast. Oregon also features full service gas attendants. Sit back, relax and let our attendants pump your gas for you!

Download your directions! You will be out of cellular range for much of the drive. GPS may be spotty or unreliable. While the drive is well signed, you'll want to print out or download your maps.

Cartwrights Deli: Stop in on your way out of town and pick up an epic picnic lunch. Recommended time: 15 minutes

It's a Burl: Become enchanted with tree houses, fountains, and fine handcrafted woodwork craftsmanship. The unique building and estate is filled with fairytale charm that creates lasting memories. Oh Highway 199 in Kerby. Recommended Time: 30 minutes

Smokejumper Museum: Learn about some of the bravest men in our history and the evolution of wildfire fighting in Southern Oregon. Recommended time: 30 Minutes

Stout Grove: Go off the beaten path and drive through some of the oldest and most well established redwood forests. Drive in awe and wonder through this one lane, heavily traveled road to become fully immersed in the redwood forest. Recommended time included in total drive time.

Crescent City / Chart Room: The road through Stout Grove will bring you out in Crescent City California. Enjoy clam chowder, fish & chips and other popular seafood at the Chart Room in Crescent City with spectacular views of the ocean harbor. Recommended time: 45 minutes

Samuel Boardman Scenic Corridor: Head north up 101 to explore the most photographed region of the Oregon Coast. With must-see stops like Natural Bridge, Arch Rock, and Whales Head, you can capture your own versions of those epic Oregon Coast photographs you see on social media! Recommended time: Included in drive time + 30 minutes for photography.

Jedediah Smith Redwoods State Park: Your return trip will bring you through Jedediah Smith Redwoods State park. Recommended time included in Drive Time, however you may want to stop and stretch your legs in this amazing forest before returning to the Rogue Valley on Highway 199.
